DENTAL CARE IS SAFE AND NECESSARY DURING PREGNANCY

Caregivers can pass cavity causing bacteria (germs) to their baby.

- Cavities are holes in teeth. Holes are formed when cavity-causing bacteria feeds on sugars inside the mouth, producing acid that attack the teeth.
- Babies are not born with cavity causing bacteria.
- Bacteria transfers from infected caregivers to babies through saliva. For example, this can happen when a baby puts their hand in the caregiver's mouth, or when spoons are shared.
- Teeth are most at risk of harm or infection when they are just coming in.

STEPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL DENTAL VISIT

- Visit Early: Your dental office wants to see you early in your pregnancy. Visiting the dentist before the baby is born reduces the baby's chance of cavities in the future.
- Plan Ahead: Plan your child care and transportation at least two weeks before your visit. Call member services if you need transportation assistance.
- Write it Down: Write down your visit date and put it somewhere handy. Reminder calls are not automatic. Missing your appointment may negatively affect the oral health of you and your baby.
- Contact Information Change: Call your dental office if your phone number or address changes.

- Bring Your ID: Bring identification to all visits (this includes Oregon Health Plan ID Cards and a Drivers' License or proof of identity).
- Know When to Call: For general questions about your dental visit or care, call during regular office hours. For emergency care, call the emergency number provided by the office
- Ask Questions: The advice given by dental staff is done with your best interest in mind.
 Ask questions during your visit to understand your treatment options.
- Bring Your Baby to the Dentist: Preventing the infections that cause tooth decay begins with the first tooth. Bring your baby to the dentist for a prevention check-up by their 1st birthday, even if you see nothing wrong with your baby's teeth.
